Ladies and Gentlemen Committee Chairpersons,

Dear colleagues,

The French Presidency of the Council of the European Union has begun in a context with many challenges, in the face of which the Union must consolidate its achievements and persevere in its fight against the pandemic, in the revival of the economy, in the consolidation of its social model and in its assertion as a global driving force in the fight against climate change. At the same time, however, Europe must renew its ways of thinking to be at the forefront, in solidarity and autonomy, of the new economy that is emerging.

Naturally, the issues of digital technology and, increasingly, space are at the centre of this economy. The ever-growing field of digital technologies in space (energy management through monitoring global warming, new modes of transport positioning, digitalization of everyday life via connected objects), which is attracting new private stakeholders (New Space) and generating new areas of conflict (arms race and anti-satellite launches, military satellite deployments, espionage) are all economic opportunities and challenges of sovereignty for the Union and the Member States. This is why we felt it was essential to discuss with you the **competitiveness of the European space industry in the face of the**

**rise of the new space economy and defense issues**, so that you could share with us your vision of the revision of industrial policy and the contribution of European defense.

We also believe that cultural influence, backed by digital tools that are changing practices, is a key condition for making an impact in tomorrow's world. Thus, our second debate will focus on the support that the European Union and the Member States could provide, in synergy, particularly in the digital fields, to the **European cultural industries** so hard hit by the health and economic crises.

The **National Assembly** had to renounce to welcome you in person on 7 February in Toulouse because of the health situation. It has nevertheless decided to hold the conference again on **2 March by video conference**.

In accordance with established practice, each parliament may delegate up to four committee chairpersons, or their representatives, to the video conference.

We look forward to having these stimulating exchanges of views with you and wish to express to you, Ladies and Gentlemen Committee Chairpersons, our highest consideration.
